The 2024 SDG Gender Index covers 139 countries, 96% of the world's girls and women, and 14 of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals. It includes 56 indicators capturing gender-related measures across the 2030 Agenda.

Index Score



Based on past trends, no country will achieve gender equality by 2030. To achieve a score of 100 in 2030, Singapore would need to improve by 2.09 points per year from 2022.







Pace of Change



Fast progress: Score increased by more than 0.6 points per year
