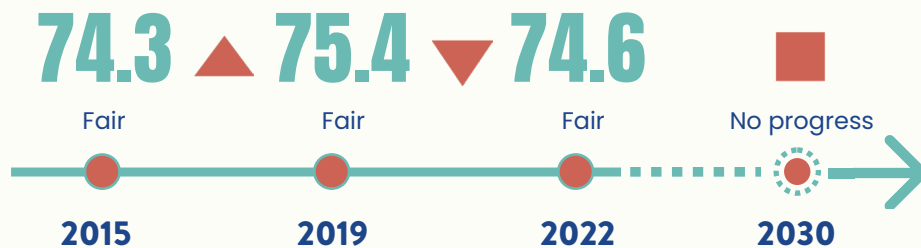

If past trends continue, the world won't achieve gender equality until 2121. How is the United States performing on gender equality in the SDGs?

The 2024 SDG Gender Index covers 139 countries, 96% of the world's girls and women, and 14 of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals. It includes 56 indicators capturing gender-related measures across the 2030 Agenda.

Index Score



Based on past trends, no country will achieve gender equality by 2030. To achieve a score of 100 in 2030, the United States would need to improve by 3.17 points per year from 2022.

Best and Worst Performing Indicators Since 2015

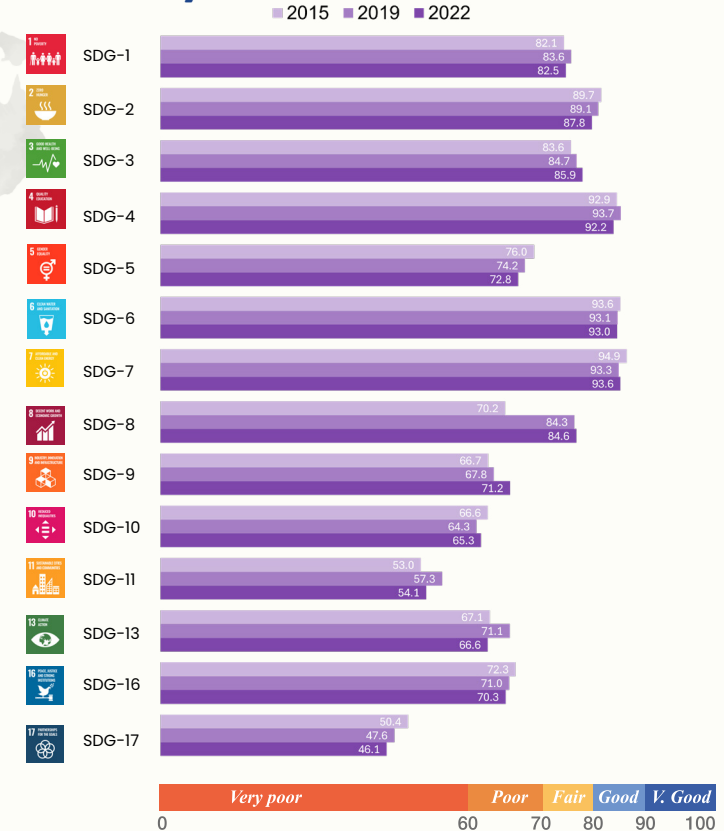
Best

- Ind. 8.4: Extent to which the country has laws mandating women's parenthood and care equality
- Ind. 13.1: Extent to which the delegation representing the country at the COP meeting is gender balanced
- Ind. 8.1: Wage equality between women and men for similar work

Worst

- Ind. 5.5: Proportion of ministerial/senior government positions held by women
- Ind. 10.4: Extent to which women can openly discuss political issues in private and in public spaces
- Ind. 9.2: Proportion of women (15+ years) who reported that they are satisfied with the quality of roads where they live

Pace of Change

- Fast progress:** Score increased by more than 0.6 points per year
- Some progress:** Score increased between 0.2 and 0.6 points per year
- No progress:** Score stayed the "same" (margin between -0.2 and +0.2 points per year)
- Decline:** Score declined by more than -0.2 points per year
